Increases are due in great part to efforts of civil society organizations in the Arab region to promote women's rights and women's political participation, and the implementation of quotas guaranteeing a percentage of legislative seats for women in Morocco, Jordan, Tunisia, Sudan, and Iraq.

Some Arab countries have very recently allowed women the right to vote and to run for election—for example, Kuwait and Bahrain. However, no female candidates who ran won in the elections. Certain Arab countries do not yet allow women to run for election, such as Saudi Arabia and Qatar.
